"To manage and safeguard the Trust so it will benefit the people of Peguis for all time. We are dedicated to apply our resources to support Peguis, to build a strong nation, to elevate the quality of life for our people and to preserve and protect the legacy that defines us as a sovereign nation."

## HISTORY

On June 29, 1998, after 91 years of struggle by Peguis First Nation, Canada confirmed it agreed with Peguis that the 1907 surrender of the St. Peter's Reserve was void and legally invalid due to Canada's failure to comply with requirements of the Indian Act of 1906. Canada and Peguis entered into negotiations to compensate Peguis for its loss of land and economic loss as a result of this illegal surrender.

On June 13, 2009, Pequis members voted in favour of the proposed settlement claim and the agreement was ratified by the parties on October 4, 2010.

The total settlement amount was \$126,094,903.00. Upon payment of settlement costs and legal fees Canada deposited \$118,750,000.00 in to the Pequis First Nation Surrender Claim Trust.

The duties and responsibilities of the Trustee are contained in the Trust Agreement. Each year the Trustees are required to provide Chief and Council and upon request any member of Peguis First Nation with financial statements for the Trust as well as a report on the administration of the Trust. The report describes the income and expenditures of the Trust, the activities of the Trustees and a report on the investments of the Trust.

The Trustees have a fiduciary obligation to uphold and implement the Trust guidelines, realize internal policy that will support the application and decision making process. This ensures Trustee due diligence and act in the best interest for all beneficiaries.

The Peguis Surrender Claim Trust Trustees hold community and public meetings. In 2016, meetings include an Annual General Meetings, one General Meeting with the community, Community Fund Trustee meetings, Financial Trustee meetings, Joint Trustee meetings and meetings with Chief and Council. Trustee and community meetings all contribute to the advancement and implementation of Trust processes beneficial to the Peguis First Nation Surrender Claim Trust and its beneficiaries.

## MAJOR ACTIVITIES AND EVENTS

2016 was an active and healthy year for the Surrender Claim Trust. Below is information on significant activities and events for 2016:

- New Trust Manager hired, who is a local community and Band Member. Sharon Stevenson, BA, HBA, CAFM, CAPA took office in February 2016. She brings a healthy and vibrant experience in financial management and Trust experience.
- Crystal Laberero departed in March 2016 after seventeen months working to set up the administration of the Trust
- The Pequis Surrender Claim Trust moved into the old CPC offices in the former Grade 1 classroom at the Pequis Recreation Centre.
- The Trust donated surplus materials and paints to the Pequis Recreation Centre to assist in the revitalization of the building.
- The honorarium vote for Trustees was held at the AGM in May 2016 and was approved after five years of operating without honorariums.
- Denise Sinclair joined the SCT office as Administrative Assistant in May 2016 and is responsible for customer service, minutes of meetings, . support to proponents on their application and administrative support of applications.
- Summer Student Courtney Bear (nee Easter) was offered the role to assist with the Per Capita Distribution reconciliation, administration and promotion of the Trust.
- Pequis Summer Works Program provided students to the Trust for 2 week rotations from July to August 2016. Summer Students included: Stephanie Sinclair, Shannon Bear, Naomi Spence, Clayton Stevenson, Jessica McCorrister, Emily Bird, Aniike Stevenson-French and Binidee Stevenson.
- The Peguis Surrender Claim Trust participated in the Treaty Parade with a float depicting the 1871 Treaty and distributed food rations for a bannock and tea meal.
- Red River College requested a work placement for Vince Stevenson, who was enrolled in the Computer Applications for Business Program. Vince assisted the staff with administrative support and Per Capita Reconciliation.
- The TLE Implementation office in Selkirk partnered with the Pequis Trusts to host a Youth Conference in Pequis in August 2016.
- The first Annual Pequis Trust Conference was held in Pequis and Selkirk. This conference is to provide information to the community members . on the two Pequis Trusts and the reason we have the trusts and the application process to access funds. We are also trying to promote continued involvement in the Trust and career opportunities within the Trust and Trust business.
- The SCT staff hosted an information session on the Pequis Trusts to the Youth Mentorship program sponsored by Pequis Employment & Training in October 2016.
- Becky Bear (Manningway) was posted to the Pequis Surrender Claim Trust for her internship with the Pequis Employment & Training Youth Mentorship Program.
- Ken Genaille was welcomed to the SCT in October 2016 as the fourth Community Fund Trustee, after the February 2016 election.
- The Trust staff also initiated staff get togethers at the Peguis Recreation Centre building with a potluck breakfast and Christmas dinner. This activity assisted in creating teamwork and healthy relationships with staff in the Recreation Centre. They are an estimated forty staff from various departments at the Peguis Recreation Centre.
- The SCT continues their campaign to promote and inform the community on the successes of the Trust and increase awareness of the resources available to the community. Signage has been posted in the Recreation Centre to promote the Community Projects funded to date.

## MAJOR ACTIVITIES AND EVENTS

APPLICATION REVIEW

Community Fund Trustees apply trust criteria outlined in section 8.2 (b) of the Pequis Surrender Claim Trust Policy when determining proposal approval. Trustees utilize their own discretion and other assessment tools when considering the projects benefit to the Pequis First Nation community.

The Surrender Claim Trustees have recognized that reviewing applications is an extremely extensive and critical process. Therefore, Trustees see the importance in understanding the status of community needs, lack of various program funds and financial constraints, to help ensure that the best interest of the community is being met.

The application process has been split into two application formats: a shorter application for request for funds under \$5,000. and a more extensive application for requests for funds over \$5,000. The Trust also utilizes an application intake three times a year: March 1st, July 1st and November 1st. The deadline process is utilized to help with annual planning and community events. The March 1st deadline is geared toward late Spring and Summer projects; the July 1st deadline for Fall and early Winter projects; and, the November 1st deadline for Winter and early Spring activities.

## APPLICANT REPORTING

The Peguis Surrender Claim Trust requires a final report on monies approved as per application submitted and assessed. This report confirms that the project has been successfully completed and that the Trust funds were able to ensure the success of the project. This final report is also holding the proponent accountable for the Trust funds received and, in turn, the Trust reports to the community. The Trust does continue to pursue final reports and support proponents to assist with the final reports.

## **FINANCIAL OVERVIEW**

Investment Income Received for the Period

The investment income and capital gains generated from Trust investments for the period was \$5,792,934. Of this amount, \$3,618,307 represents interest and dividend income and \$2,174,627 represents realized net capital gains.

#### Expenditures Beneficial to the Beneficiary

The amount of \$1,325,576 was disbursed to the community for approved projects and programs as listed earlier.

#### Trust Property Approval Limits

Approval limits regarding applications for Trust funds increase each year by the rate of inflation. The Community Fund Trustees can approve amounts up to \$84,386, the Community Funds Trustees and Chief and Council can approve amounts up to \$281,287. Amounts greater than \$281,287 must be approved by the Community Fund Trustees, Chief and Council and the Members of Peguis First Nation.

#### Investment Activities of the Trust

The Trust funds are managed by TD Waterhouse Private Investment Counsel, Beutel Goodman Investment Council and Mawer Investment Management Ltd in accordance with the objectives of Peguis First Nation and as set out in the Trust Agreement and Investment Policy Statement. Generally, the objectives are to provide safety of principle, stable and consistent income flow and capital appreciation. The investments consist of government and high quality corporate bonds and equities. No more than 30% of the Trust funds can be invested in equities.

#### Value of the Trust

The value of the Trust investments as at December 31, 2014 was \$130,640,746. The net value of the Trust as at December 31st (excluding the line of credit accrued liabilities) was \$122,694,920.

#### Investment Review Summary


With respect to the Peguis First Nation Surrender Claim Trust, we are pleased to report that the combined Trust holdings remained positive under the investment management of Beutel Goodman and Mawer Investment Management, up 4.01% (or a gain of \$4,597,475) over the last twelve months. Furthermore, over the long term and since inception of the Trust, the combined holdings have recognized an annualized return of 7.25% (or a gain of \$38,339,413) which has added value over and above the market benchmark return of 5.90%. Based on the investment policy's average annual return target of 3.50% + CPI (where CPI or inflation has been 1.25% since inception), the Trust's return objective in the current environment equates to 4.75%, which the combined holdings have significantly outpaced.

Since Inception (Annualized) Rates of Return as at December 31, 2016




Portfolio Valuation as at December 31, 2016
